Our house should be completed in the next 4-6 weeks and this is the only thing that we would need in order to move in. Right now, my husband, myself, and our 2 children have been living with our parents and in our travel trailer for the last 8 months. It is extremely important to us to be able to move into our house. We understand that we will have to pump out the holding tank as necessary as we do not want to contaminate the watershed and we understand it is our responsibility to have it pumped out as needed. 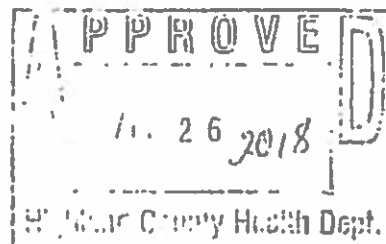

BOARD OF HEALTH MEETING HIGHLAND COUNTY, OHIO

Tuesday, January 15, 2019

The Highland County General Health District Board of Health held its January, 2019 meeting on January 15, with the following members present:

1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Holt at 4:40PM.

2. Roll Call

The following individuals were present at the meeting:

Mr. John Holt
Mr. Rob McCray

Philip Webb, Sanitarian
Anna McCoppin, Director of Environmental Health
Connie Page, Fiscal Officer
Jared Warner, Health Commissioner

3. Resolution No. WPCLF 2019-00 Authorization

Ms. McCoppin provided a brief overview of the sewage grant funding available to HCHD in the 2019 period. The 2019 EPA funding level was set at \$150,000. Mr. Edgington made a motion to approve the grant authorization with Mr. Warner acting with signatory authority for the project period. Mr. McCray seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

4. Merle Miller, HSTS Holding Tank Resolution, Hillsboro, OH - Sewage variance request

Ms. McCoppin presented a proposed variance to allow a property owner to use a septic tank for wastewater storage until the weather improved enough to allow full system installation. Mr. McCray made a motion to approve the variance request with the stipulation that septic pump receipts must be submitted to the health department monthly until the system fully installed. Mr. Edgington seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

5. PHAB Update

Mr. Warner provided an update on PHAB activities. A new Community Health Assessment process is underway. The first community meeting was held on December 6 at the health department. Significant progress has been made on documentation collection.

6. Review – Act on minutes for December, 2018

Mr. McCray made a motion to approve the December 2018 minutes. Mr. Edgington seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

7. Review – Act on Bills for December 20 – January 15, 2019

Ms. Page provided a list of bills for December 20 – January 15, 2019. After discussion, Mr. Edgington made a motion to approve the bills. Mr. McCray seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

8. 2018 Budget Revisions

Ms. Page presented an updated 2018 final budget report. Discussions with the county auditor's office led to some minor changes to the previously reviewed and approved budget appropriations. Mr. Edgington made a motion to approve the revised 2018 budget. Mr. McCray seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

9. Legislation Review

No legislation review was conducted at this meeting.

10. Open Discussion

EH Technician – Mr. Warner provided an update on the EH Technician hiring process. After discussion, Mr. McCray made a motion to authorize Mr. Warner to proceed with candidate selection and allow candidate start time as soon as appropriate in the hire process. Mr. Edgington seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

May 2019 Levy – The BOH discussed the possibility of running a levy in May. This levy could cost between \$11,000 to \$12,000. In order to address this expense, hiring a nursing director would be delayed for a few months. Mr. Edgington made a motion to place the levy on the May Primary Ballot. Mr. McCray seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Strategic Plan Review – Mr. Warner provided an update on the strategic plan action items. Most items remain on track for completion, while a few deadlines may need adjusted or extended.

CHIP Action Plan Review – Mr. Warner provided an overview of progress made on CHIP Action Plan items. Many action items have shown significant progress in 2018.

Lipid Profiles – The BOH discussed funding to support 50 free lipid screenings for February 2019. Mr. Edgington made a motion to approve this expenditure. Mr. McCray seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Nursing Poverty Level and Sliding Fee Scales

Mr. Warner presented the BOH with updated poverty and sliding fee scales for 2019. After discussion, Mr. Edgington made a motion to approve this expenditure. Mr. McCray seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

11. Adjourn

Mr. McCray made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Holt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting was adjourned at 6:30 PM.

A resolution authorizing Jared Warner to complete the application, certification, and other related agreements for the placement of a Replacement Levy on the ballot for May 7th, 2019.


Whereas the Highland County General Health District seeks to replace the existing 1989 levy with a replacement levy; and
